Conceived by a group of motivated surgeons in 2007, The Arizona Trauma Association (AzTA), formerly AZTrACC, shared a common goal: to improve the delivery of health care to injured patients throughout the state of Arizona by supporting collaborative research, education and outreach activities of trauma centers in the state of Arizona.

Mission, Values, Vision

Mission:

ARIZONA TRAUMA ASSOCIATION is a multidisciplinary, trauma collaborative for Arizona healthcare providers and organizational leaders that improves care for injured patients through education, advocacy, prevention, and research.

Values:

- Leadership: We influence the Arizona trauma care system to improve patient outcomes.
- Shared-Expertise: We invest in education, quality improvement, and research to cultivate optimal care.
- Collaboration: We build partnerships to develop access to trauma care and promote injury prevention.

Vision:

ARIZONA TRAUMA ASSOCIATION is an influential trauma collaborative for the continuous improvement of the delivery of care for injured patients within Arizona.

ORIGINS AND EVOLUTION OF ADVANCED PRACTICE PROVIDERS

The advanced practice movement emerged in the mid-1960s in response to rising demand for care and a shortage of primary care physicians intensified by the 1965 expansion of Medicare and Medicaid. In 1965, Dr. Loretta Ford and Dr. Henry Silver launched the first nurse practitioner program at the University of Colorado, demonstrating that advanced-trained nurses could safely and effectively extend access to care. That same year, Dr. Eugene Stead at Duke University inaugurated the first physician assistant program, training former military medics and corpsmen to function in expanded clinical roles under physician supervision.

Rapid adoption of both NP and PA models in the 1970s prompted national standardization. The American Nurses Association began developing educational and certification frameworks for NPs, while the American Medical Association created accreditation pathways for PA programs and established the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants (NCCPA). Through the 1980s and 1990s, regulatory and legislative milestones gradually expanded standardized scopes of practice, prescribing authority, and interstate recognition.

Today, NPs and PAs form the core of the advanced practice provider workforce across primary care and high-acuity settings, filling critical gaps in access, enhancing teambased care, and measurably improving patient outcomes across the continuum.

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

AN INTENTIONAL DECISION

Adison Leigh Rayburn wholeheartedly understood the power of sharing life.

"She actually registered to be a donor twice," her parents, Rob and Shannon Rayburn, say. Adison passed away after an asthma attack in December 2023. Through her decision to register as an organ and tissue donor, she saved the lives of three and offered other gifts for research.

"She was one of the brightest, most curious kids," says Shannon.

Her parents think she would be elated to learn she saved the lives of other people. They say her decision to register as a donor was "deliberate" and "intentional."

The Rayburns say the donation process has had a lasting influence on themselves as well. "It has helped to know that not all of our daughter is gone," Shannon says.

Adison, an animal lover, lived with her girlfriend of five years and two cats before her passing. Her family describes her as bright, curious and unapologetically herself. Adison's final act was a selfless decision that uplifted the lives of many.
